*"I have been a visual artist for twenty five years (1986- 2010) and believe that art is a universal language. Vietnamese people, no matter where they are in the world, will never stop fighting for freedom. Vietnam is our Motherland. The tragedy of the South China Sea will live forever in the minds and hearts of Vietnamese people. It will affect many generations to come. My last word: I give thanks to Australia for giving me and my people freedom."*

Lk. Anh Tuan is a popular artist of the Vietnamese community. This Exhibition includes 35 works depicting life in Vietnam before and after the war, the memories of his escape, life in the refugee camp, and his new life in West End, Brisbane.
